Below is our partial song list. For parties this adds up to about five hours from start to finish which includes roughly three one-hour sets and breaks. We usually start playing about 30 minutes to an hour after the party start time as experience shows this makes the biggest impact on your guests. We also show up about an hour before your event start time to set up. Our contract will have particulars as to how much space we need and other important details. We bring an iPod to play prior to the start of our show and in between sets, but are happy to use an iPod you provide as well.

Fee/Gratuities:

captain jack is available as a 4-piece (electric or acoustic), 3-piece (acoustic) and a 2-piece set (acoustic). Since there are many items that affect the cost such as special requests, driving distance, day of the week and other factors, we ask that you call for a price and to check availability. The price doesn't go down for shorter play times since the set-up and break-down is exactly the same (which is the hard part). Gratuities are completely optional; however, if you have a very good time and want to show your appreciation they'll be accepted as will gifts of small children, cigars and electronics. Larger shows may warrant adding additional equipment as well as a sound technician and a lighting engineer (if stage lighting is desired).

Overnight Shows:

If you're more than three hours or four hours from Baltimore then it's possible we'd need to consider the show as an overnight show. This adds a whole new dimension because we have to figure hotel costs, car rental, food, flights, and potentially gear rental (back line) depending how far we're traveling. Contact us and let us know the details of your event and we'll help you figure everything out. We can also put you in touch with event planners to handle your event from start to finish.

Expectations:

We are musicians so you can expect us to drink your booze, eat your food and take your women, but don't worry we don't drink much. You can also expect to have a good time – although some people we just can't help. Also, please make sure that the venue realizes that we are “guests” at your party and not “contractors.” And lastly, if you want the party to be more “festive” then ALWAYS put the food and beverage near the music. If you want it to be more casual and the music to be more “in the background,” then we'd recommend separating them.
